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### Zion's New Missionaries!

For the past several years, Zion has partnered with the other congregations of the South Dakota District to financially support oversees missionaries who have served in as pastors or been affiliated with South Dakota. We call this partnership "Together in Mission (TIM)".

Just in this last year, there have been several additions to the list of missionaries that our district is supporting! God's call to go out to all nations and preach the Gospel has come to several pastors who were recently serving in South Dakota, and they have answered that call faithfully.

**Rev. Samuel Bobby**, who previously served as senior pastor at St. Paul's, Aberdeen accepted a call to serve as a missionary in Riga, **Latvia**. Pastor Bobby teaches at a seminary based in Latvia called Luther Academy and also serves a church in Riga. Luther Academy not only trains pastors for the church in Latvia, but also offers online courses that train Lutheran pastors all over the world, many of them from countries where Christianity is illegal or marginalized and who would be unable to receive pastoral training in any other way.

**Rev. Jordon Andreasen** was recently serving as pastor of Our Savior, Aberdeen and St. John, Columbia, before accepting a call to serve as a missionary in Brasov, **Romania**. Pastor Andreasen will be working with the Confessional Lutheran Church in Romania to plant Lutheran congregations in Romania as well as in other Balkan countries.

**Rev. Jonah Domenichelli** has accepted a call to serve as a missionary in **Germany**. He is currently in the process of raising a network of financial support before he and his family make the move to the mission field. Pastor Domenichelli served previously as the pastor of Risen Savior, Tea.

In addition to these new pastors, Together in Mission will also continue to support **Rev. Daniel Jastram**, missionary in Tokyo, **Japan**. Pastor Jastram coordinates efforts to make Lutheran resources of theology and worship available in all of Japan. He provides regular services at worship sites, plans for and manages translation work of theological resources, and nurtures relations with local Lutheran pastors facing individual challenges to the faith. Pastor Jastram's wife Joan grew up in our congregation! (*Continued on page 11*)

- I. Call to Order & Devotion Pastor Grimmer led us in prayer. - II. Congregation Member Comments thank you cards were shared with the council.
- III. Adoption of the Agenda adopted with additions to the new business-Adam made motion to adopt agenda, 2nd by Marvin, motion carried.

### IV. Reports

- A. Secretary's Report correction for voters meeting date should be January 23rd (4th Tuesday of the month) motion made to correct date by John, 2nd by Larry W, motion carried.
- B. Treasurer's Report Larry S reported income \$93,452 and expenses of \$39,129. Motion made to accept treasure's report by Adam, 2nd by Larry W., motion carried.
- C. Financial Secretary's Report no report
- D. Pastor Grimmer's Report Pastor Andreasen who is conducting the marriage retreat at the Highland Conference Center on February 9-10th will also preach and give a presentation between services on Sunday, February 11th as a mission festival. A door offering will be collected. Allan and Jamie Biermeyer would like to hold a Financial Peace University class. There is an \$80 cost per participant/couple for the class. A recommendation was made for Zion to pay 1/2 of cost to help off set participants expense. Motion made by Marvin, 2nd by Chris, motion carried. The extra copier was purchased for \$648 which is less than the price it would have been to ship it back to company. Pastor Grimmer presented information on a proposal to add an assisting Pastor that has been brought to the elders, St. Paul Plankinton and Trinity White Lake. 

- **CONGRATULATIONS!** In November the leadership of the congregation challenged the rest of the congregation to match their \$28,000 in contributions by the end of 2023. You didn't only meet that challenge but went above and beyond. The rest of the congregation gave \$44,222.56. That is wonderful!

- We are currently working to finalize and sign contracts and also set a schedule for construction to begin in the spring. Even though no dirt has moved in these subzero temperatures, we are still making progress!
- Did you know you can make your gift to Zion (building related or not) go further? If you are retired and are taking Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) you can direct all or part of those funds to Zion Lutheran Church and reduce the amount of taxes you have to pay! - By now we have done our best to reach every member of the congregation, but some were unable to be reached. If anyone still has questions, please reach out to one of the Building Committee members. We would love to still visit with you about the project!
- We cannot stress enough to keep praying for our project and wisdom as we continue to move forward with God's work.

The building committee takes confidentiality very seriously. As we are embarking on a fundraising campaign each of our committee members have signed a confidentiality agreement that any sensitive topic discussed do not leave the meeting room. We have created a process to ensure your anonymity, any pledges and gifts for the building project turned in are recorded by financial secretary. The counters, pastor, staff, or committee members will not input any individual's gift or pledge. All the gift and pledge information like our other offerings is kept in the Church 360 software. As appointed by council there are only three individuals who have access to the donation information of the church. This is to ensure we have limited exposure and liability. This system allows for segregation of duties and dual control, so all records of the church are maintained accurately and professionally. We are doing this to protect all givers confidentiality.
